## Bay Back Wildfowl Guild Memories: Remembering Bill Walsh

Founder, Director, Curator, Mentor, and Friend 1935 – 2025

With profound sadness, the Atlantic Wildfowl Heritage Museum and the Back Bay Guild announce the passing of our founder, curator, and guiding light, Bill Walsh, on May 12, 2025, at the age of 90.

Bill's passion for preserving the history, artistry, and traditions of Virginia's wildfowl heritage was unparalleled. His vision brought the Atlantic Wildfowl Heritage Museum to life within the historic deWitt Cottage, transforming it into a place where stories of decoy carvers, hunters, and the natural beauty of Back Bay and the Atlantic Flyway would never be forgotten.

#### A Legacy Carved in History

Throughout his decades of service, Bill was not just a curator, he was a teacher, storyteller, and friend to all who walked through the museum's doors. His legacy includes:

Founding the Atlantic Wildfowl Heritage Museum, ensuring the preservation of our region's water fowling traditions for future generations. Championing local carvers and artisans, providing them with a place to showcase their work and pass down their skills. Establishing the Back Bay Guild, bringing together a community dedicated to the appreciation and conservation of our wildfowl heritage. Mentoring volunteers and historians, sharing his knowledge generously, always with a warm smile and a captivating story. Advocating for historic preservation, ensuring the deWitt Cottage and its surrounding gardens remained a beacon of Virginia Beach history and hospitality. Bill's influence extended beyond the museum walls. His commitment to community, culture, and conservation earned him the respect and admiration of countless individuals, organizations, and visitors from around the world.

### Speak Up for Waterfowl Habitat in Virginia Beach

The City of Virginia Beach is currently weighing the option to convert a 19.5-acre lake off of Oceana Boulevard into a fill site, or Borrow Pit, for materials from public dredging operations, specifically from navigation channels and stormwater facilities. The Planning Commission, an 11-member body appointed by the City Council to review land use and zoning matters in Virginia Beach, will review this proposal at their May 20th meeting.

This lake plays a small but important role in waterfowl habitat for migrating and wintering waterfowl along the Atlantic Flyway, as it usually holds hundreds of diver and puddle duck species during this winter months. The local Back Bay Chapter of Delta Waterfowl has also installed wood duck boxes on the site.

In 1985, the City Council granted a Conditional Use Permit allowing the site to be used as an 11-acre borrow pit, known as Lilley Pit/Baillio Sand Pit. In 2001, an expansion of the borrow pit was approved, increasing its total size to 16.59 acres. Since completion of the excavation in 2016, the borrow pit has transformed into a lake in accordance with the approved conditions.

Now the City is moving towards filling in the entire lake and when the filling of the borrow pit is complete, the site will be converted to grade of 14 feet to 22 feet.

On top of the negative habitat impacts this will have for migratory waterfowl, there are also concerns about contamination of well water to surrounding residents, noise pollution from vehicle and equipment operating 12-hours a day 7-days a week and impacts to storm runoff in the area.
